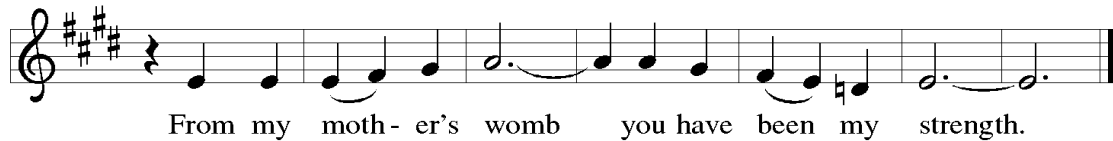

Amen.


