## *‘The Pastor’s Pen’*

Greetings to you in the name of our Risen Lord Jesus Christ!

Each weekend here at Good Shepherd during worship our acolyte/servers meet our ushers at the front of the altar rail to give them offering plates. In the next 3 to 4 minutes that follow, as the choir sings an inspirational song, you and I put an offering of money, cash, checks, and coins into the plate. As these plates return and the ushers give them back to me or to the acolyte/servers, I have recently wondered, do you ever think about this question: **‘Why do I give?’** and **‘What happens when my offering goes into the plate?’** Aside from the logistics of counting and depositing, here is what happens when our offering goes into the plate...

### It makes a difference in the ministry of our congregation:

As we make an offering to the Lord in worship through our congregation,

- It helps us to provide for pastoral leadership for our church.
- It helps us to have available all that is necessary to have meaningful weekly worship.
- It helps us to address the needs of our building—pay for utilities and maintenance.
- It helps provide for Christian Education, Sunday school, VBS, Bible studies, etc...
- It helps us to share the gospel in our community in word and action.
- It makes fellowship events possible that bring us together as Christian sisters and brothers.
- It provides for the many different types of supplies we need to do our ministry—paper, copier, pencils, pens, tape, ink, kitchen supplies etc.
- It provides for our staff who work to help our congregation’s ministries run smoothly, efficiently and effectively.
- It helps provide funds for all of our committee’s ministries to help make a difference in the community we serve and in the world.

### It makes a difference in the ministry of our Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod:

A portion of our offering through our ‘Mission Support’, also known as ‘Benevolence’ as well as from other congregation in our Synod goes on to the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod.

- It provides support for congregations as they go through the search for pastoral leadership. It provides counsel and guidance for congregations in times of conflict or crisis.

- It provides resources for congregations in many areas of ministry—worship, Christian education, evangelism, stewardship, social outreach, ecumenical relationships, financial responsibility and record keeping—plus the on-going ministry of the Synod Resource Center.
- It provides support to our camps—Lutherlyn and Agape.
- It provides support to Gettysburg Seminary.
- It enables us to continue the mutual relationship of support we have with Thiel College, Lutheran Service Society, Lutheran Senior Life, Bethesda Children’s Home and Glade Run Lutheran Services.
- It supports our ecumenical work with Christian Associates.
- It supports our Lutheran campus ministry in the Oakland section of Pittsburgh.
- It helps make possible Synod mission trips like the ones that have helped people in Mississippi and New Orleans after hurricane Katrina, and in New Jersey after hurricane Sandy. And also for our Stay At Home Mission Work camp for youth in Millvale, Pa.

It makes a difference in the church wide ministry of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America:

A portion of our offering also goes on through mission support to the ELCA. There,

- It supports 240 missionaries serving through 40 different countries.
- It supports the starting of 70 new congregations across the country.
- It supports the renewal of congregations across the country.
- It supports the training of pastors through 8 seminaries.
- It supports over 180 campus ministries.
- It provides for resource people and other resources to strengthen the ministry of our congregations.
- It supports the work ecumenically with other Lutheran church bodies across the world as well as other denominational church bodies.

So, as you can see, as you may ask the question, ‘**Why do I give?**’ and ‘**What happens when my offering goes into the plate?**’ Your offering **REALLY** makes a difference. **THANK YOU!**

## **SWPA Women of the ELCA Annual Convention at Bishop Connare Center, Greensburg:**

**All Women are invited** to the SWPA W/ELCA annual convention at the Bishop Connare Center in Greensburg on Fri., May 13<sup>th</sup> & Sat., May 14<sup>th</sup>. The Theme is “Mold Me, Fill Me, Use Me” based on Isaiah 64:8. It will begin Friday afternoon at 2:00 with an optional workshop entitled “Go Forth, Save, Preserve and Share”. At this workshop we will learn how to take the time to document and preserve our church history in all its facets for not only ourselves but for our Synod and our Community.

Friday night at 6:30, a business meeting will be held where we will be electing a Vice-President, Secretary, and 4 new Board Members. We will also be electing 5 delegates (voting members) for the 2017 Triennial Convention of the churchwide W/ELCA to be held in Minneapolis July 11-13 2017. Among these 5 delegates we must include 1 woman of color or a woman whose primary language is not English and **2 of the elected must be first time Triennial attendees**. If you are elected to be a delegate, your trip to and from Minneapolis is paid for by churchwide including hotel and meals during convention days. You will not be in meetings the whole time so I hope you will prayerfully consider being nominated to be a voting member. Bonnie Altman (with the assistance of Karen Coates Gesalman) attended the 2014 convention as a voting member and would love to share details of the experience with you. Please consider running for one or all of these positions. (I have nomination forms.)

The convention will continue Saturday morning with a Bible study led by Pastor Randy Gullickson from Camp Lutherlyn. Then you will then have the choice of 2 workshops. “The Potters Hand” will be a pottery demonstration by Robert Isenberg from Camp Lutherlyn or “Me, Talk to God?” will be a presentation on learning to pray given by Joan Orr. Fair Trade will have an area set up with their wares for sale both days. Saturday afternoon, we will be asked to elect the 2017 Designated Outreach recipient. There will also be messages delivered (with time for questions) from our SWPA Bishop Kurt Kusserow, a church wide W/ELCA representative and a representative from “Jeremiah’s Place”. Convention will end Saturday afternoon with the Bishop leading us in worship. Registration for this event is due by April 15<sup>th</sup> (after this date you must pay and extra \$5 to attend).
